Welcome to the SPBW West Riding Branch Newsletter for May 2021.

Pubs have now reopened for service outside only as from April 12<sup>th</sup>.

The rule of six and table service are in place.

Provided the conditions set by the UK Government are met, pubs in England are due to reopen indoors on the 17<sup>th</sup> of May.

The rule of six will once again apply.

All restrictions are due to be lifted from the 21<sup>st</sup> of June.

If all goes to plan, we may be able to have a monthly meeting on the 4<sup>th</sup> of July.

Many pubs in our area have now reopened, but obviously, those with no access to outside space have remained closed.

Leeds CAMRA sent out a list of 200 pubs which have now reopened, and other local CAMRA branches have also sent out lists of open pubs.

Some pubs are taking bookings, but many are "walk-ins" only.

One of the reasons for this is that some inconsiderate people have booked tables, only to fail to turn up.

This results in a loss of business to the pub, probably having turned away customers earlier.

I've visited a few pubs, including Bridge Inn and Old Kings Arms in Horsforth, Jacob's Ale House in Bradford and The Hop / Archie's Bar and Kitchen in Leeds.

The Hop and Archie's appear to be working as one venue as far as the outside space is concerned.

I've been very impressed by the beer quality in all of the pubs that I have visited.

Everything seems to be well organised, and fortunately the weather has been very good.

However, I did have a drink in Harrogate with Roland and got quite wet sitting outside the Harrogate Tap with rain and sleet alternating.

We had a good time, though, and the Starling Café Bar has created an outside space behind the pub which is quite pleasant. It is necessary to walk through the pub to get to the outdoor area, so facemasks are required.

### Pubs Reopen – Outside Only

On Monday April 12th we visited the Corn Dolly in Bradford (at the bottom of Bolton Road for those who do not know it).

This is an excellent pub which has been in the CAMRA Good Beer Guide for many years and won many awards for its excellent beers.

They have spent a lot of money making their car park into a large, superb beer garden with 2 different levels of decking, little box type covered areas with separate compartments for tables and seats which would sit 4 comfortably and 6 at a pinch.

The decking areas have a mixture of socially distanced seating and tables for 2, 4 or 6 people.

We went suitably dressed in case of cold weather with layers of clothing on, but as the

weather was so beautiful, we soon started stripping off these layers.

We got there at 12:00 noon when it opened (although it opened early due to there being people waiting), signed in (we haven't got the app so signed in manually) and spent the whole afternoon there.

They had 5 or 6 different beers on - we had a Phoenix beer and Goose Eye Chinook (both were excellent).

We met up with some friends and saw many other friends also who we chatted to at a social distance of course.

This is an excellent pub, and I would advise anyone who can to visit it - it is open every day of the week from 12:00 noon.

On Friday 16th April we ventured into Halifax (there aren't many pubs open here) and visited the Kopenhagen.

This was quite enjoyable, and they had a about 4 real ales and plenty of other ones.

We were very boring and again had our favourite beer Goose Eye Chinook.

Then we went to the Grayston Unity which didn't open until 3pm.

This pub has been shut since last autumn when it was mothballed for the winter.

They have seating for approx. 70 people some of it under cover with heaters installed.

Again, it was such a wonderful day that we didn't need our layers of clothing and had another enjoyable late afternoon superb drinking session.

It will be interesting to see the Graytson Unity once we are allowed to go inside pubs as they have knocked a wall out and made it into one large room - there will be more room for seating, and they will be able to let more people in. This pub is only open at present from Thursday to Sunday (please check the opening times before visiting).

Along with many other pubs, these two pubs are open and have really made an effort to provide an excellent beer garden experience.
