Mike Field R.I.P.

Unfortunately, we have lost another member of the SPBW West Riding Branch.

I have received the following update from John Gibson:

I regret to inform you of the death of Mike Field who was a member of West Riding SPBW as well as a major force in the Heavy Woollen Branch of CAMRA. Mike was a founder of the West Riding Brewery and the Beerhouses group, starting with the West Riding Licensed Refreshment Rooms in Dewsbury.

The group later took over the Sportsman, in Huddersfield, the Cricketers in Horbury, the Stalybridge Buffet Bar, Idle Beerhouse in Idle, Bradford and the Old Turk in Dewsbury.

All fantastic pubs and a great legacy.

A private funeral took place on Tuesday 17th August.

The family extended a welcome to all Real Ale drinkers to join them afterwards in a celebration of Mike's life at the West Riding pub, Dewsbury Railway Station.

Mike also part-owned Anglo Dutch Brewery in Dewsbury, which later became Partners Brewery.

On behalf of the branch, I would like to express our sincere condolences to Mike's family and friends.

He will be sadly missed.

Bishop's Castle

On a recent visit to Shropshire, I visited the Three Tuns Inn, which has the Three Tuns Brewery right next door.

The town itself is very pleasant, as is the pub.

As the weather was quite nice, we sat outside on the trestle tables next to the brewery.

The brewery, under separate ownership to the pub since 2003, supplies all of the pub's beer.

Both were established in 1642, and the pub appeared in the first CAMRA Good Beer Guide in 1974.

The beers available on the day of our visit were:

XXX Pale Ale 4.3% Cleric's Cure IPA 5% Solstice 3.9% Light Zesty Ale Stout 4.4%

I had the Solstice, which was a lovely refreshing floral beer, just right for sitting outside in the sunshine before a long walk along the Ridgeway.

I also tried the Stout, which was a traditional dark & creamy example of the style with deep flavours.

Whilst we were sitting outside, the brewery was going through the process of cleaning the mash tun, with the spent grains being washed out of a shute in the small tower brewery into a trailer.

We had a discussion with the assistant brewer, who said that the spent grains were going for animal feed.

After a well-deserved rest, they were going to start a new brew of the Cleric's Cure, which was going to be sent to Holden's Black Country Brewery in Dudley for bottling.

We also visited the Six Bells, which was previously a brewpub – Six Bells Brewery closed in 2018.

They now mostly sell beers from Ludlow Brewery.

After our walk, we visited the White Horse Inn at Clun, which is home to the Clun Brewery.

I had a pint of the Clun Pale Ale 4.1%, which was a pleasant way to finish our visit.
